

AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance Defining Nuisances and Providing
Penalty for Violation of the Same.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF
THE VILLAGE OF WINNEBAGO:

Section 1. NUISANCE DEFINED. It is hereby declared to be
a nuisance for any person within the limits of said Village;

First - To so negligently conduct any business or use any
premises as to create such an offensive smell as may taint the air
and render it unwholesome or disagreeable to the neighborhood.

Second - To cause or suffer the carcass of any animal or
any animal or vegetable matters, slop, swill, suds, garbage, filth,
stable drippings or offal or noisome substances of any kind to be
collected, deposited or to remain in any place in said Village to
the prejudice of others.

Third - To own, keep or use any railroad car, yard, pen,
place or premises, in or upon which cattale or swine shall be
confined or kept, so as to be offensive to those residing in the
vicinity, or an annoyance to others.

Fourth - To erect, continue or use any building or other
place for the exercise of any trade, employment or manufacture,
which by occasioning noxious exhalations, offensive smell or
otherwise is offensive or dangerous to the health of individuals
or of the public.

Section 2. DUTY OF VILLAGE MARSHALL. For the purpose of
carrying the foregoing provisions into effect, it shall be the
duty of the Village Marshall to make from time to time, and as
often as may be necessary, a thorough and systematic examination
of the Village, and to ascertain and report to the President of
the Board of Trustees for prosecution all violations of this
Article; and for this purpose they shall be permitted at all times
to visit and enter into or upon any building, lot or grounds with-

in the jurisdiction of the Village and to make examination thereof.

Section 3. PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation who shall create, suffer or permit any of the nuisances hereinabove described in Section 1 shall be subject to a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) and not exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in every case, and to a further penalty of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for every day the same shall continue after notice to remove and abate such nuisance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
