ORDINANCE NO. 314

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE OFFENSE OF
LOITERING AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR
SUCH OFFENSE

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the
Village of Winnebago, Illinois:

Section 1: Any person who shall within the Village loiter or
lounge in or about any public grounds, place or building during the
night time for any immoral purpose or to the annoyance of residents
and others and who shall idly and without lawful business and with
evident intent or purpose of annoyance, disturbing or insulting others
by any acts, gestures or language or shall for immoral purposes stand
or be in and about any of the streets, alleys, walks, public grounds
or other places either during the day or night time or who shall ob-
struct any walk, street or other public place within the Village by
lounging or loitering in, upon or about the same after being requested
to move on by an officer, shall be guilty of loitering.

Section 2: Any person or persons found guilty of the offense of
loitering as herein defined shall be subject to a penalty of not less
than Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars
for each offense.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its
passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
