

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE FIRING OR DISCHARGING OF FIREARMS
WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF WINNEBAGO, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of
Winnebago, Illinois:


Section 1.

It shall be unlawful to discharge any firearms within the Village,
provided, however, that this section shall not be construed to prevent any
Police Officer from discharging a firearm in the performance of his duty, nor
any citizen from discharging any firearm when lawfully defending his person
or property, except on private grounds or premises under circumstances when
such instrument can be discharged so as not to endanger any person or property
and so as to prevent the projectile from tranversing any grounds or space
outside the limits of such grounds or residence or except as otherwise specifically
authorized by ordinance or statute.

Section 2.

Any person found guilty of violating this Ordinance shall, upon
conviction, be fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than
five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from JUNE 3, 1991,
the date of and after its passage, approval and publication, as provided by
law.

ORDINANCE NO. 91-4

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE FIRING OR DISCHARGING OF FIREARMS WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF WINNEBAGO, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Winnebago, Illinois:

Section 1.

It shall be unlawful to discharge any firearms within the Village, provided, however, that this section shall not be construed to prevent any Police Officer from discharging a firearm in the performance of his duty, nor any citizen from discharging any firearm when lawfully defending his person or property, except on private grounds or premises under circumstances when such instrument can be discharged so as not to endanger any person or property and so as to prevent the projectile from traversing any grounds or space outside the limits of such grounds or residence or except as otherwise specifically authorized by ordinance or statute.

Section 2.

Any person found guilty of violating this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from June 3, 1991, the date of and after its passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.
