Meeting Minute Approval— TOBY MYERS made a motion to approve minutes from March 24, 2011 meeting and ROGER SMITH seconded the motion.

1. **Budget** – The budget for the police department was reviewed. The current budget is approximately 6% under our overall police budget.
2. **Chief's Report** – In-car cameras for the police cars will be installed within the next week or so. None of the squads have required serious repairs since last committee meeting. A stone chip was repaired in the windshield of the 2007 Dodge.

The Chief will be attending a technology conference during the week of May 1, 2011. This conference was sought out by the Chief and all expenses (less the Chief's wage) will be covered by the federal government. It is required that the Chief give a PowerPoint presentation during this conference.

The Crime Stoppers banquet will be Wednesday, May 18, 2011 at Noon at Giovanni's restaurant in Rockford. The Village will pay \$150.00, which will entitle up to ten (10) attendees.

Sergeant White and Officer Dave Seitz will represent Winnebago during the annual Blue-Mass Service in Rockford which honors local officers who have died in the line of duty. This service also kicks off National Police Week.


3. **Community Policing Update** – Officers will become more involved with community-policing efforts in and around the Village. The Chief is encouraging more interaction with citizens, business owners, and community events as time allows.

4. **New Business** – The Chief has been approached by a citizen about creating an ordinance to authorize the use of golf carts within the Village. The committee does not want to pursue this at this time because of safety reasons. However, this topic will be addressed at the Board meeting in May.

The police committee recommends the purchase of a new police vehicle to replace the 2006 Impala. Although the police department has received trade-in figures for the 2006 Impala, the committee believes it may be a good idea to advertise the 2006 Impala and accept sealed bids. This will also be addressed at the Board meeting.

The Chief shared annual racial-profiling information with the committee members.
