

ORDINANCE NO. 91-3AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A TIME LIMIT FOR PARKING ON
THE STREETS AND ALLEYS IN THE VILLAGE OF WINNEBAGO, IL.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of
Winnebago, Illinois:

Section 1.

That it shall be unlawful for the owner or person in charge of any
motor vehicle to allow such to remain on any public street or alley within
the Village for a period of forty-eight (48) consecutive hours or more.

Section 2.

That the Police are hereby authorized to order any motor vehicle
which all have remained on any public street or alley within the Village
for a period of forty-eight (48) consecutive hours, or more to be removed;
if such motor vehicle shall not have been removed within six (6) hours after
notice to the owner or person in charge thereof to remove the same, the Police
shall cause the vehicle to be removed to some suitable place to be designated
by the Chief of Police; and the owner of such motor vehicle so removed shall,
upon paying towing costs and any storage fees applicable, be entitled to the
return of such motor vehicle. Notice may be given by verbally notifying the
owner or person in charge, or if the owner or person in charge cannot be readily
found by placing a written notice on the windshield of the car.

Section 3.

Whenever a Police Officer has given written notice to the owner
or person in charge of an illegally parked vehicle to remove the same as
described in Section 2 of this ordinance and the owner or person in charge
of the vehicle fails to do so within twenty-four (24) hours, they shall be
fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than twenty-five (\$25.00).
In addition, they shall be fined for each additional offense as long as the
vehicle remains on the public right-of-way.

Section 4.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from JUNE 3, 1991
the date of and after its passage, approval and publication, as provided by
law.

Section 3.

Whenever a Police Officer has given written notice
to the owner or person in charge of an illegally parked
vehicle to remove the same as described in Section 2
of this ordinance and the owner or person in charge of
the vehicle fails to do so within twenty-four (24) hours,
they shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor
more than twenty-five (\$25.00). In addition, they shall
be fined for each additional offense as long as the
vehicle remains on the public right-of-way.

Section 4.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from
June 3, 1991, the date of and after its passage,
approval and publication, as provided by law.
